A Conversation with Elizabeth Stevenson, DTM

If you've been hiding under a rock, it's time to wake up and smell

the excitement because the 2023 D103 annual conference is just around the corner! This eagerly anticipated event brings together district members, family, and friends from all over to connect, learn, and grow as a community. Mark your calendars for April 21-22 and get ready for a conference like no other.

This year's conference is jam-packed with incredible content that's sure to inspire and motivate you. From two world-champion keynote speakers to the Evaluation and International Speech contests, you won't want to

miss a moment. And with two of our district's finest serving as your emcees, you can expect an event that's both entertaining and informative.

I had the pleasure of sitting down with this year's Conference Manager, Elizabeth Stevenson, to get a sneak peek at what's in store. Elizabeth has been a dedicated Toastmasters member since 2006, and her passion for the organization is contagious. She's held various leadership roles, including TLI Registration Chair, Area Director, Division Director, and Conference Manager (back in 2010). Elizabeth even helped found New Faith Toastmasters while serving as a Division Director.

Elizabeth's enthusiasm for this year's conference is contagious. She's a true servant leader who is committed to getting every member excited about attending. With such an incredible lineup of speakers and activities, it's easy to see why. And now, let's hear from Elizabeth.

**HAAJi:** For those who are unfamiliar can you share some information about your role and responsibilities as Conference Manager?

Elizabeth: I am responsible for coordinating a team to help develop, implement, and organize a conference. The goal is to bring as many people as possible to our event to learn about the Toastmasters organization, to network with fellow Toastmasters that we may not have seen in a while, and to hear the best speakers in our district battle it out in speech contests.

There will be an Evaluation speech contest and an International speech contest. The International speech contestant is going to go on further to compete for that coveted World Championship of Public Speaking title. In fact, we have two World Champions of Public Speaking as our keynote speakers this year. It is the conference chair's responsibility to make sure that we have great speakers who will attract our members and guests.

It is also the responsibility of the chair to ensure that we have teams that will work in their individual areas to bring this entire conference to fruition. These teams include the finance team, the PR and publicity team, the logistics team, and the technology team.

Speaking of the tech team – since this is a hybrid event, we need to make sure that we have people in place who can advise us on the technology requirements. We want this experience to be just as vibrant and exciting for the person that's online as for the person who is attending in person. We don't want there to be a disparity, and so the technology team is critical and important to the complete success of this event.

We will also be naming the District Leadership team that will take us into 2023—2024, including the District Director, Program Quality Director, Club Growth Director, and Division Directors. These are all elected officials, and we will find out who our team is at the conference.

We will also find out who the speech contest winners are, hear from our keynote speakers, and enjoy some entertainment.

The conference is designed to meet the needs of our members, and we will recognize members for their hard work since last year's conference. It's a great time to see Toastmaster friends we haven't seen and to introduce our physical family to our Toastmasters family.

This is a great opportunity to learn about our own leadership skills. This is a team effort with many moving parts, and we meet regularly to hammer out a great program. We want to ensure that this conference takes into consideration everything that worked at the last conference, as well as address those things that could be improved.

**HAAJi**: The theme of this year's conference is "Drive Your Vision to a Higher Ground." What do those words mean to you?

Elizabeth: I'd like to invite every single member of the D103 community to drive their vision to a higher ground. As you might have guessed, I was listening to Stevie Wonder. He's a hero of mine. Certainly, he has talent and the vision to make his dreams come true, to make his goals a reality. He never stopped. He pushed forward all the time. He did not let the absence of visual acuity stop him from taking it to another level. I think that we are ready in District 103 to take our goals and our Toastmaster journey to another level. We need to always be learning, and Toastmasters allows us the ability to do that. This conference reminds us that even in COVID times we can challenge ourselves. We can put our best foot forward. We can be great communicators. We can be great leaders.

**HAAJi:** That being said, last year I joined virtually and it was exciting to be able to take part in the conference, even though I wasn't there in Chicago. How will you ensure that those joining in virtually will be able to have an engaging experience?

Elizabeth: We have factored in spaces for those who are joining us virtually to have an opportunity to participate in activities, such as virtual table topics. We have engaged people to ensure that during break times and when speakers are not on stage there are still activities for our virtual audience to participate in.

I tested the virtual portion myself by dialing in to segments of our conference from the hotel last year. So I want to ensure that those

who are dialing in are engaged and are a part of everything that's going on. We will have visuals for them and will engage them in events, including the First-Timer Orientation which will be hybrid. We will have a person in the room and our speaker/teacher will be dialing in. From the ground up, we are including our hybrid

Toastmasters who are dialing in at every level and every segment of this conference.

**HAAJi:** Let's talk about the keynote speakers. Who are they and how did you decide on these world champion powerhouses?

Elizabeth: First, we have Ramona J. Smith. She is the 2018 World Champion of Public Speaking, and she won her title in Chicago! I have photos from that event, including from photo opportunities with her. But the thing about her win in Chicago was that the second place and third place winners were also women. So that was history making. For the first time ever, the top three winners were female.

The Loop did a feature article on her in January, and didn't even realize that she was going to be one of our keynote speakers. And so that is really nice that some more information about her is already in print. The second keynote speaker is Edward Hearn, the 2006 World Champion of Public Speaking. He is originally from Springfield, Illinois. But he's a Chicagoan. He won in Washington, D.C. He's a minister and a motivational speaker. So we've got a local theme

Both speakers will be addressing the conference theme "Drive Your Vision to a Higher Ground." They will tag team throughout the conference, giving their keynote addresses. Then, they will be made available for a VIP session. And what that means is that you have an opportunity to be one-on-one with the world champions during the conference! **HAAJi:** The keynote speakers sound impressive! What about the other sessions – can you share some information about the educational sessions that will be offered?

**Elizabeth:** We have four workshops designed to mimic the four

categories from the Toastmasters International conference: Professional Development, Personal Growth, Inclusive Excellence and Public Speaking.

First we have Eric Vernsten, a pretty new Toastmaster speaker. I'm excited that we're going to have someone that we don't always see. He'll be under the Public Speaking track, talking about improving your speaking with improv comedy. Second, we have Calvin Gibbs Jr, who is a familiar name in D103. He'll be under the Professional

Development track, talking about the purpose and benefits of professional development. Third, we have Haseena Shaheed Jackson, under the Personal Growth track. She's going to talk about raising the ceiling, tackling fears, and addressing obstacles. Finally, Yvette Beasley, speaking under the Inclusive Excellence track, will discuss how to remove limitations and barriers caused by biases.

We are also having a session called Club Quality Panel Discussion. It is designed to address club leadership questions and issues. It is designed to address questions that our leaders and members have about how to wind down their year; how to bring on those last members as you're working toward your goals; how to bring on new members, how to orient them; how to close out your Distinguished Club Program (DCP); and how to elect new officers for the next year.

**HAAJi:** All that sounds incredibly helpful and timely. I know there's a lot of planning and coordination to bring all this relevant information to our attendees. Can you tell me a little bit about the team you're working with to bring this event together?

**Elizabeth:** Absolutely. You mentioned the big word delegation. That is something that I have to work on, because I like to have my hands on things. I like to see things through, and I have to trust that my team is going to step into their roles and finish the job that they

are tasked with. So let me mention some of the roles that make up my team.

- We have the Education Chair, Saundra Washington.
- Our Sponsorship co-chairs are Audrey Schroeder and Stella Lorenz.
- The Publicity and Promotions Chair is Robert McKenzie.
- Our Finance Committee chair is Latrina Oddo.
- The Registration Chair is Wanda Williams-Griffin.
- Our Logistics Chair is Cassandra Lee.
- The Volunteers Committee Chair is Cheryl Lane.
- The Technology co-chairs are Ivory Gwin and James Larmie, with special support from Prince Leftridge.
- The Decorations Chair is Chelsea Thomas.
- Then, you have our District Program Quality Director (PQD) Sam Sukumar and our district director, Dionne Leggin. She absolutely is looking over our shoulder, making sure and ensuring everything is "up to snuff," if you will.

**HAAJi**: What does success look like for you and your team?

Elizabeth: Oh, my gosh. Success looks like every single club (in D103) coming to the conference. Success looks like rooms overflowing with numbers that we hadn't anticipated. Success looks like our corporate partners clamoring to be a part of the event and commemorative book. Success looks like everyone dressing up, feeling beautiful, attending the event and feeling a great sense of accomplishment and having a great time. Good food, fellowship, networking, listening to music and thinking about what they want to do in Toastmasters in the next year. That is success!

**HAAJi:** Now, for someone who has never attended a D103 Toastmasters conference, why would THIS year a great opportunity for them to go for the first time?

Elizabeth: Because they will not be disappointed. You will not feel like one person in a room full of strangers. There are no strangers in Toastmasters. There will always be someone nearby wanting to tell you about the Toastmasters experience. There will also be other people who want to tell you about their own Toastmaster experience. The benefits of Toastmasters are so great that a person walking in off the street will be intrigued, interested, ask questions, sit down, come in, join us. They will not walk away empty-handed. You will definitely be satisfied.

### Who do you know that could Serve as an Area Director for D103?

Serving as an Area Director (AD) is a great next step for any current club officer, especially the Club President (PRES), Vice President Education (VPE), Vice President Membership (VPM) and/or Vice President Public Relations (VPPR).

When you serve as an Area Director, you will hold one of the District Executive Committee (DEC) roles. As an Area Director, you will:

- Serve as the direct liaison between the district and the clubs in your area.
- Conduct club visits with the clubs in your area twice a year to understand and support the clubs' needs; assess club membership growth; determine educational achievements of club members; and submit area visit reports online to Toastmasters International,
- Communicate regularly with your Club Presidents their club's status in the Distinguished Club Program,
- Motivate and assist each club in your area to become a Distinguished club or better.
- Hold at least two (2) Area Council meetings to address the needs of the clubs in your area; discuss the plans and goals of each club in the Distinguished Club Program; review attendance at club officer training; and provide club awards and recognition,
- Coordinate area speech contests,
- Discuss district training and other district events with the clubs in your area,
- Participate in Area Director training provided by the district,
- Attend District Executive Committee (DEC) meetings once per month; and
- Participate in division and district sponsored events throughout the club year.

Area Directors are eligible for re-appointment for one succeeding term only. Those who successfully complete a one-year term as Area Director will receive credit toward their Pathways Distinguished Toastmaster (DTM) award.

### 2022 - 2023 District 103 Club Growth Committee

Changes to improve the Toastmasters Club Coach Program are now in place. The moves are designed to forge the best fit possible between clubs and well-qualified coaches so that more clubs can flourish.

The changes took effect July 1, the beginning of the 2022–2023 program year, and they are outlined on a new Club Coach Program webpage. The new program policies were crafted by the 2020–2021 Policy Review Committee, composed of past and current members of the Toastmasters International Board of Directors. "The main purpose of implementing new rules for the Club Coach Program is to strengthen it and make it more robust," says Deepak Menon, DTM, Toastmasters' 2019–2020 International President, who co-chaired the Policy Review Committee. "These changes

are also expected to increase the success rate of the program by ensuring that there will be fewer slippages." New requirements for club coaches will ensure such members are experienced, committed, and "have the knowledge that the clubs they coach can benefit from," says Menon.

A coach must complete the Club Coach Training Module before beginning an appointment. The module is in Pathways Base Camp, and it provides an overview of the Club Coach Program for club members, club officers, District leaders, and prospective coaches. This way, everyone is aware of what the club/coach relationship involves and what is expected from the partnership.

There are monthly checkpoints that allow for club coaches to gather and discuss the progress of the clubs they are coaching along with the variety of successes and challenges. These sessions are to also get the necessary resources for coaches to be more effective in helping clubs become distinguished or better.

On the following page is the list of New Club Coaches that are currently assigned. All assignments are 6-12 month appointments.

### MONTHLY CHECKPOINT

This is a meeting for the club coaches to gather and discuss the clubs they are coaching along with the successes and challenges.

### Requirements to be a Club Coach

- Have completed, at a minimum: Level 2 in a Path, Advanced Leader Bronze, or Advanced Communicator Bronze
- Are not currently coaching any other club
- · Are not a current member of the club they wish to coach
- Have not been a member of the club to be coached during the past 6 months
- Be appointed by Toastmasters International headquarters to start their club coach term
- Serve as a club coach for a minimum of 6 months, up to a maximum of 2 program years
- Help the club reach Distinguished status (or better) in the Distinguished Club Program (DCP) during their club coach term

### **Receiving Credit**

Clubs can now have a minimum of three members (and no more than 12) for a coach to be appointed. (One or two coaches can be assigned.) Coaches receive credit toward the Distinguished Toastmaster award (DTM) if the club achieves Distinguished or better status in the Distinguished Club Program. Coaches can now also fulfill an additional DTM requirement if the club reaches 20 or more members in addition to being Distinguished or better. The additional credit is expected to entice more members to be club coaches.

To earn the credit, coaches must now:

- Serve as a coach for a minimum of six months by the end of the program year (June 30).
- Coach only one club at a time.
- Complete and submit a Club Coach Preliminary Report and Club Coach Progress Report every 60 days, and a Club Coach Final Report once the coaching assignment ends.

In the three reports, coaches answer questions relating to what initiatives they've undertaken to help the club, what challenges they face, how they are tackling them, and what growth opportunities there are for the club in the future. The reports will put an early spotlight on potential problems and allow time to brainstorm effective solutions, he adds.

The coach will also receive a 360-degree evaluation completed by members of the Club Executive Committee. The coach will get feedback on their skills in areas such as leadership, team building, and problem solving.
