

Moves to Region 4

All Districts: The new regional structure will necessitate adjustments to how Districts receive support from leadership. Previously assigned International Directors (IDs) and Region Advisors (RAs) may no longer oversee your specific area due to the shift in regional boundaries. This is particularly relevant for District 103, which will be transitioning from Region 5 to Region 4 as of July 1, 2024. For District 103 and any other Districts impacted by the realignment, it's crucial to take some proactive steps to ensure a smooth transition. Firstly, it's essential to identify your new regional leadership team by consulting the updated region maps and District list. Familiarize yourselves with their contact information and areas of expertise. Secondly, explore any potential changes to support protocols or communication channels established by the new leadership. Proactive communication with the new IDs and RAs will be essential to maintain a seamless flow of support for your District.

2024 International Director Candidates: Those with aspirations to run for an International Director position at the upcoming Annual Business Meeting in 2024 should pay close attention to the revised regional structure. The open positions will be specifically designated for even-numbered regions. This is important for District 103, as it will now be part of Region 4 (assuming it's an even-numbered region). To ensure a successful candidacy, it's vital that interested individuals submit their Letters of Intent with the new regional breakdown in mind. Aligning your application with the correct region will streamline the nomination process and demonstrate a clear understanding of the revised organizational structure. For instance, if District 103 falls under Region 4 and it's an even-numbered region, then a candidate from that District would be eligible to run for the International Director position designated for Region 4.

International Leadership Committee Members: The committee's composition will undergo a significant shift in February 2024 to reflect the new regional makeup. Appointments will be made to fill vacancies from even-numbered regions. Current committee members serving their second terms who hail from odd-numbered regions may find themselves no longer geographically aligned with the region they were initially appointed from. For these members, the realignment could potentially lead to a transition in their role or responsibilities. The organization should provide clear communication and support to these members throughout this potential shift. For example, if a member from District 103 (originally in Region 5) was serving on the committee for that region, the realignment might necessitate their transition to a different committee role or even their departure from the committee altogether, depending on the new regional makeup.

Region Advisors: The application process for the coveted 2024-2025 Region Advisor term will be directly impacted by the region realignment. This is particularly relevant for District 103, as its move to Region 4 will determine which Region Advisor position they can apply for. Individuals with an interest in applying will need to ensure they are submitting their application for the region they now fall under according to the updated map. The organization will likely send notifications to existing applicants informing them of the realignment and confirming they are applying for the correct region based on the new structure. It's also recommended for interested individuals to stay updated on any potential changes to the application criteria or selection process that may arise due to the realignment. District 103, along with all other impacted Districts, should be particularly attentive to these updates to ensure they submit a competitive application.



He drew a powerful parallel between Toastmasters leaders and buffalo, explaining how they bravely face challenges and pave the way for others, just like our leaders empower members to find their voice and hone leadership skills.

Fursey Gotuaco, our returning keynote speaker, captivated the audience with his insightful presentation on "5G Communication of

Courageous Leadership." He outlined five key elements - Goals, Gratitude, Growth, Greatness, and Global - and emphasized the importance of clear communication in leading effectively. This resonated with a participant who, during the Q&A session, shared a powerful story about how focusing on "Growth" within their club led to a mentorship program that revitalized member engagement.

Building on this momentum, we introduced a new concept - the
Leadership Lab Workshop. In this collaborative environment, Toastmasters
were randomly placed into breakout rooms led by fantastic facilitators.
They tackled real-world challenges like club conflicts, member recruitment
and retention, and fostering diversity and inclusion. The energy crackled in
the room as attendees brainstormed solutions. One group, for example,
came up with a creative membership retention strategy using a buddy
system, which many participants found valuable.

The afternoon Club Officer Training provided in-depth guidance on specific roles and responsibilities.

Participants actively participated in interactive exercises, making the training session engaging and informative.

Throughout the TLI, the dedication and collaborative spirit were truly inspiring.

Everyone was eager to learn, ask insightful questions (e.g., a participant inquired about

strategies for managing challenging club dynamics), and prepare to lead their clubs to new heights. The lessons learned here extend beyond Toastmasters, and I have no doubt these experiences will have a lasting positive impact on our Toastmasters community. Thank you to everyone who participated and made this TLI such a success!




> provided a safe space for attendees to ask detailed questions, discuss their individual roadblocks, and receive tailored advice to help them navigate their unique DTM journeys.

Each year, District 103 Toastmasters recognizes its members who have made significant contributions to the organization and their communities by presenting awards for Toastmaster of the Year, Division Director of the Year, and Area Director of the Year.

Toastmaster of the Year - Martha Brock Leftridge, DTM3

Toastmaster of the Year is awarded to a member who has demonstrated exceptional leadership and dedication to Toastmasters, both within their club and beyond. This award recognizes individuals who have gone above and beyond to help others achieve their goals and have made a significant impact on their club and the organization as a whole. The Toastmaster of the Year award recognizes individual(s) who are not a member of the District Executive Council but whose dedication, commitment and efforts have made a significant contribution towards achieving the district's mission within District 103. To be eligible for this award, the nominee must be a paid member of a Toastmasters Club within District 103. Nominators must also be paid members of a Toastmasters Club within District 103.

Division Director of the Year - Dr. AlyceAnn Crump, DTM

The Division Director of the Year award is given to a Toastmaster who has excelled in their role as a Division Director. Division Directors are responsible for overseeing multiple clubs within their area, providing support and guidance to club leaders, and ensuring that their division is meeting its goals. The Division Director of the Year award recognizes individuals who have shown outstanding leadership, communication, and organizational skills in this role.

Area Director of the Year - Theresa 'Terri' Banks, DTM

Area Director of the Year award is presented to a member who has demonstrated excellence in their role as an Area Director. Area Directors are responsible for overseeing a group of clubs within a geographic area, providing support and guidance to club leaders, and ensuring that their area is meeting its goals. The Area Director of the Year award recognizes individuals who have shown exceptional leadership, communication, and organizational skills in this role.

Distinguished Toastmaster, Rebecca Daly chaired the Leadership Committee tasked with the selection of the Leadership Awards recipients. Rebecca's team were bound by the Award's criteria. All accomplishments and activities must have been within the period from July 1, 2023 to March 31, 2024.
